

**Minutes for the July 25, 2011 Shore Drive Community Coalition General Meeting**

Meeting Location: Ocean Park Volunteer Rescue Squad Meeting Hall

Meeting Start: Called to order at 7:35 pm by David Williams. 17 attendees.

Special Presentation: **David Williams – Hurricane Preparedness Presentation.**

Officers Reports:

President David Williams – Passed report to Old/New Business.

Vice President Tom Cantwell – No updates.

Treasurer Carol Collins – Total balance \$6,162.00. Special Accounts balance \$1,561.99.

Secretary Todd Solomon – June 27, 2011 minutes were handed out. **Motion to approve minutes with no changes was made by Empsy Munden and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Tom Cantwell. Motion passed unanimously.**

Old Business:

**Neighborhood Dredge and Transfer Station Project** – City Council approved a resolution on June 14<sup>th</sup> to have the Beaches and Waterways Commission study the city-wide plan. Study will be presented to Council Feb 7, 2012. The material from this project will NOT be beach quality sand. Estimates show cost of \$60-\$80/cy for mechanical and \$20/cy for hydraulic methods. David is talking to the B&WC chair to determine how the citizens will provide input. Safety, noise, smell, boating, road damage are just a couple of the issues. The BZA will hear an appeal on Aug. 3<sup>rd</sup> to decide if the residential site can be designated as an industrial transfer facility. City Council/Staff and BZA are concerned that citizens are provided misinformation. Cape Story has said they will speak in opposition at BZA hearing.

**Pleasure House Point** – The Trust for Public Land will be submitting a grant application for \$3 million. Last year, they missed approval by 2 spots. So there is a very good chance of approval this year. Barbara Duke, City Parks & Rec, will be attending our Sept General Meeting to ask for citizen input on what should and should not be allowed on the PHP.

New Business:

**Shore Drive Safety Improvements** – The Mayor has asked to submit a \$1.5 million grant to add bike lanes on East bond section of Shore Drive from Kendall St. to the North End. City plans to work Phase III next. This is the section of Shore Drive from Lesner Bridge to First Landing State Park. City Staff plans to hold a public listening session this fall. Speed limit, median closures, curb and gutter and sidewalks will be topics of interest at these meetings.
