

**SUBJECT: CIP 8-014 Lynnhaven Inlet Maintenance
Dredging Project - Preconstruction Notification**

This is to provide an update on the Army Corps of Engineers project to maintain Lynnhaven Inlet and connecting waters. The Army Corps of Engineers' contractor, Southwind Construction Corporation, will be dredging from Lynnhaven Inlet to Broad Bay with the project anticipated to occur from the end of October through the end of February. The project includes hydraulically placing approximately 80,000 to 100,000 cubic yards of beach sand materials onto Ocean Park Beach and approximately 5,000 cubic yards of beach sand materials onto the Maple Street Dredged Material Management Area.

During the contract we will need cooperation to assure that all Hobie cats and other personal items such as volleyball posts are removed from the beach prior to the beginning of the work. Boats left on the beach may be towed to the City garage at the owner's expense. Your help in avoiding this would be appreciated.



When the project is underway, sections of Ocean Park Beach will be temporarily closed and the work areas will be moving westward from the Lesner Bridge towards Rookery Way. Please be aware that heavy equipment will be on the beach during this project so please adhere to signs or instructions to ensure your safety and enjoyment of the beach as well as allowing the contractor to complete his work.
