LESNER BRIDGE UPDATES





AMI, Inc. in Portsmouth, continues to build the new bridge segments. A total of 90 of the 168 bridge segments had been cast by mid-December

A word of driver caution: As segments are delivered to the project site or to the gantry, Virginia Beach Police will temporarily stop traffic at **the Shore Drive/East Stratford Street Intersection for a few minutes** to assist the segment delivery trucks in safely crossing this intersection. These deliveries are not on a set schedule, but will generally occur between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. weekdays and on some Saturdays. Be careful as you approach this intersection.

City Recycling holiday items

Public Works/Waste Management will be accepting live Christmas trees for recycling at curbside on normal waste pickup days. Trees must be stripped of ornaments and tinsel. Many gift packaging materials can also be recycled in the blue recycle cart. Items that are accepted include gift boxes, tissue paper, holiday cards, cardboard and plain wrapping paper. Items that are not accepted in the blue cart include bubble wrap, ribbons, tape, bows, tree decorations, Christmas lights, sticky gift labels, laminated or coated gift bags, or cellophane. Plastic bags and foam peanuts are also not accepted in the blue recycle cart but can be taken to the City Landfill and Resource Recovery Center and any Pak Mail location to be recycled.

Report auto break-ins

The Shore Drive area was hit with a rash of auto break-ins between Christmas and New Year's. In some cases, windows were smashed; in others, unlocked cars were rifled. The Police Department asks that ALL break-ins be reported to the non-emergency number (385-5000), even if nothing is missing so the department can react to trends.
