Secretary's minutes from 27 NOV 2017 approved and accepted.

President Todd Solomon opened tonight's meeting by introducing Det. J.I. Cole and Det. C.C. Daniels from the VB Police Department's Economic Crimes Unit. Det. Cole briefed the meeting on what should be done in case of identity theft, an improper transaction or breach of a person's financial account or credit/debit card. First, call the VBPD (757-385-4101) to report the theft and receive a Report Number. This is very important if you are going to document your loss and attempt to receive your funds back. The VBPD report number serves as documentation of the theft and eliminates the claimant's debt obligation in most cases. The Computer/Economic Crimes Unit will investigate all financial crimes if over \$200 (felony limit). The detectives provided excellent handouts giving important contact numbers and web sites to assist in monitoring your credit reports, reporting theft, opting out of unsolicited mail offers, and registering for the "Do not call" registry. A copy of these excellent handouts will be posted on the SDCC website.

Vice President Wally Damon reported that BAC did not meet in December, but would meet 18 January.

President Todd Solomon noted that the city have placed two "your speed" devices on Shore Drive. Additionally, speed and car counter strips monitoring units have also been placed on the road. SDCC had initiated, approved, and submitted to City Council a resolution requesting the city to purchase and install "your speed" devices along Shore Drive. The city will inform SDCC of its findings when completed.

Other comments included:

- City Council has deferred their vote until March on possible changes to city regulations related to Short Term Rentals.
- The city will hold public meetings 6-8 pm on 25 January at Princess Anne HS and 29 January at Bayside HS to inform the public and gather

comments on the area's Sea Level Rise issue. Information will include the 5, 25, and 50 year projections of sea level rise for this area.

- Phase 4 Shore Drive Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) remains unfunded. Todd was informed by Vice Mayor Jones that the 2018 budget was closed, but possible funding for the CIP might be available in the 2019 budget.
- The area website Nextdoor.com has reported a problem with several packages being stolen from in front of neighborhood homes. Some packages have been opened from the bottom with a box cutter, the contents removed, and then taped closed so as to appear unopened. These thefts are being investigated and resident's security tapes reviewed. A white Volvo may be associated with these thefts.

At the close of 2017, two positions on the SDCC board (Secretary and Treasurer) will be open for 2018. A possible slate was submitted from the floor, accepted, and voted upon. Tim Solanic was elected Treasurer and Andy Broyles elected Secretary. Todd thanked them both for stepping forward and accepting these positions.

Todd personally thanked both of the outgoing board members, Treasurer Kathy Pawlak and the Secretary David Williams for their duties well performed over these many years.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:08 pm.
