Junes and plan is project will last about 60 days. Jade Street
work starts next week with heavy equipment being staged. All
sand will be pumped from the Lynnhaven Inlet. Mr. Rommel
Tamayo, City Coastal Project Manager, and Mr. Chris Tolson, U.S.
Army Corps Of Engineers’ project manager will be making
presentation in SDCC June meeting.

4th of July in Cape Story / First Landing State Park re: fireworks.
No response yet from Councilman Wood. Empsy spoke with the
Mayor who will get info back to her this week. Discussions to
have CoVB take over fireworks are still be lobbied for.

Shore Drive intersection work at OPVRS starts next week.

Cape Henry Ditch - a volunteer trying to work with CBF has

They suggested he work with CoVB to secure a legal plan to
work on clearing out the ditch. He possibly might make a
